This month, we will be focusing on social activities. Social skills begin to develop as soon as a child can interact with the world around them. This helps to enhance brain development. To encourage this development, we will have group tummy time as well as singing and reading activities.

We will be working on some fun St. Patrick's Day art projects and later in the month, Easter projects.

Recently, we've noticed an abundance of random socks. Some of the older babies enjoy pulling them off., while the younger ones just kick their little legs until they fall off. Toddler News (Room 202)

This month the toddlers are getting ready for Spring. As our weather changes, we will continue to develop our scientific thinking and learning by formulating "why, what and where" questions. Outdoor walks and sensory table activities will provide many opportunities to ask these questions. We will be exploring solutions with simple problem-solving in our day to day challenges. We are learning to identify problems verbally with continuing to use our words in the classroom with our teachers and peers. In math, we will be working on the concept of time as we talk about the past and explore words that indicate the future. This is evident when we hear sentences like "today will be warmer than yesterday". We are learning spatial relations when introduced to concepts such as over/under, next to/behind, and inside/outside. We will explore the spatial concept by engaging in activities to follow clues to find hidden objects, such as "It's near the window" or "It's under the climber.

Preschool News (Room 203)

March is here! It comes in like a lion and goes out like a lamb! We will learn what that phrase means, as we investigate all different types of weather throughout the month. We will be answering the important questions like 'how does a rainbow form? Where does rain come from? and what do clouds actually do?'. We will be charting and graphing weather patterns, doing some experiments with wind, and water, and discussing what types of weather we like best and what we like least. Along with weather, we have some important holidays we want to celebrate. On March 2nd, we will be having a "Birthday Whobilation Celebration" as we honor the Ultimate Cheermeister, Dr. Seuss! We will also be celebrating and learning about St. Patrick's Day! Do you know why we wear green that day? We will find out!
